



Presentation guidelines

Oral presentations

Except for keynote lectures, oral presentations are scheduled for 15 min. This includes time for questions and hand-over, so please prepare to present your results within 10 – 12 min. The presentation slides should be prepared in powerpoint (pptx) or pdf format, and are to be uploaded with USB drive onto the presentation laptop one day in advance or latest during the break before the scheduled oral block. To avoid unnecessary delays, the use of personal laptops for presentation will not be possible.

Posters

Posters must be **in portrait format, with size A0** ($\approx 90 \times 120$ cm). Larger posters will not fit on the poster boards. We encourage authors to include either a “sharing encouraged” or “sharing not permitted” label in a corner of the poster, to indicate if taking pictures is welcomed. No printing service is offered on site. Posters will be displayed during the entire meeting and will be accessible for viewing and discussions in all breaks besides the dedicated poster times.

We ask all poster presenters to give a **short (1-2 min) flashtalk** in the corresponding time block (see program). This will allow presenters to advertise their poster and foster exchange and discussions. Flashtalks should be based on a single powerpoint slide, which, besides the title of the contribution and name of author(s), contains one or two eye-catching figure(s). As examples, you might show: a key result of the study, a simplified graphical summary of the poster, or simply a teaser stirring interest for the poster. General remarks

- Slides, presentations and posters must be in English, and we encourage the use of large figures and font sizes. Consider using colour schemes accessible for colour-blind people.
- As communicated during acceptance after the pre-inscription, the lecture hall of the venue is rather small. It will also be possible to follow the oral presentations in an adjacent meeting room via live-broadcast. This meeting room is also available during the conference time for working / preparation.
- Talks will not be recorded.
- Same as for any conference, we expect an open and respectful conduct of all attendees, based on basic politeness and scientific integrity.
- Taking pictures/videos of talks or posters is not permitted, unless explicitly authorised by the presenter.
